

#### **EVALUATION CRITERIA**

A single stage open tender process was used in line with the Public Contract Regulations 2015.

#### ACCREDITATIONS AND CERTIFICATIONS

# Financial Stability Assessment


#### **CALL OFF/AWARD OPTIONS**

The Framework allows clients the option of direct award or mini competition.

When calling off projects, clients can use any one of a range of standard forms of building contract including JCT/SBCC, NEC3/NEC4, ACE, PPC, TPC, FAC1, or their in-house agreement.















LHC uses the FAC1 standard form of contract to manage our frameworks. The LHC pro forma, which should be read in conjunction with the FAC1 in published form, details the terms and conditions that govern the operation of the framework, including the procedures to call off projects under the framework.
